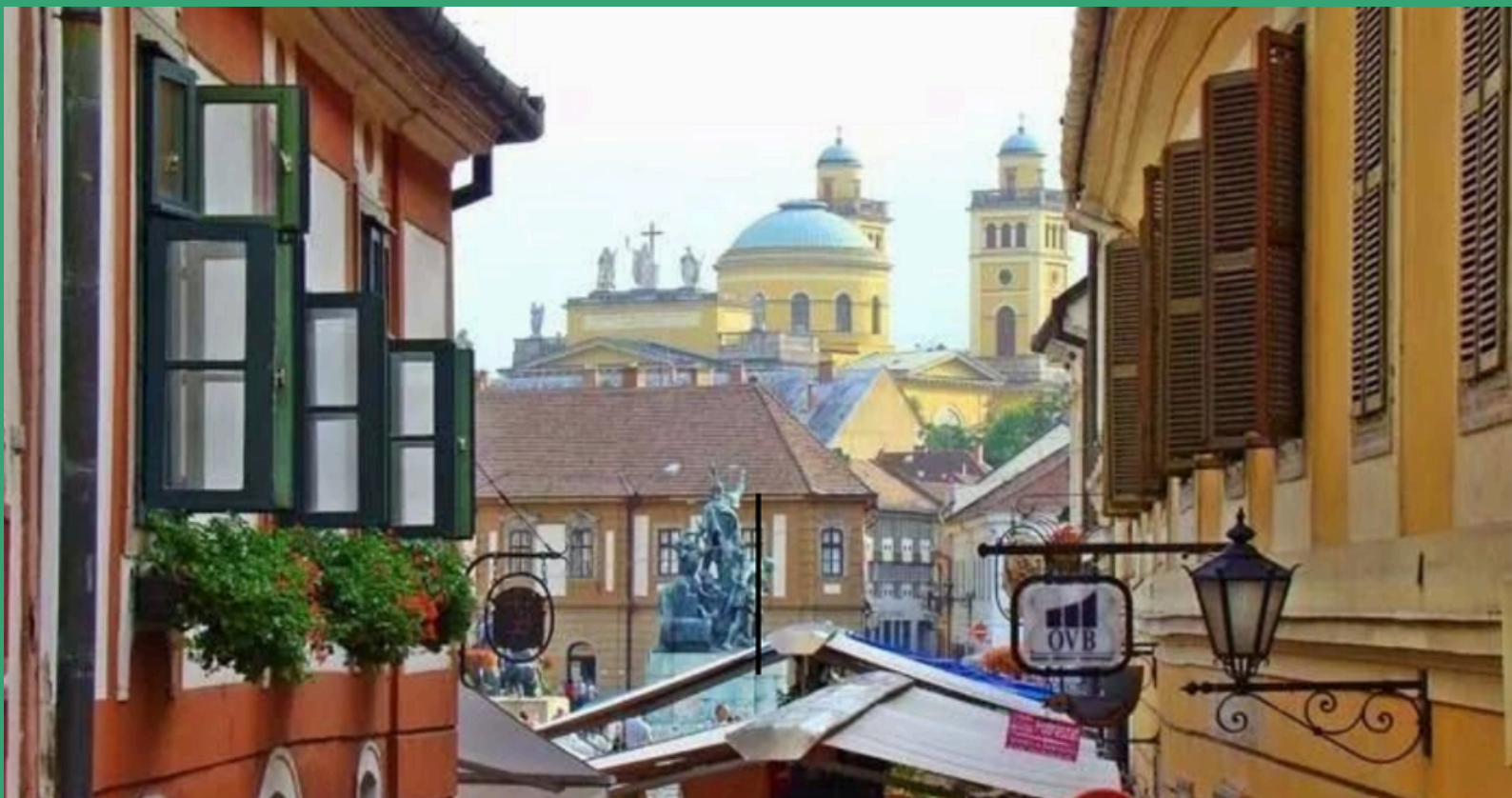

BACKGROUND OF THE CARPATHIAN CIVIL SOCIETY PLATFORM



The Carpathian Civil Society Platform and Hub, a non-registered informal network of civil society organization was established in 2018 by the Carpathian Foundation-Hungary, in cooperation with its Polish, Romanian, Slovakian, and Ukrainian partners operating in the Carpathian Region. Its establishment had multiple reasons. First, the ecosystem of civil society deteriorated in the last decades in Central and Eastern Europe, and civil societies face several challenges, such as unfavorable political, legal, and financial environments and increasing social and territorial inequality, especially in such peripheral, disadvantaged regions like the Carpathians. Second, this challenges those civil society organizations (CSOs) that are working for the most unfavorable social groups, they are far from the centers and have limited access to information and funding resources. Third, although civil society organizations are working hard to achieve their mission and goals in a difficult environment and are initiating innovative solutions to community problems, they operate in isolation from each other and lack support and encouragement. Fourth, in the case of the Carpathians, there is a lack of systemic solutions for integrating the development potential of the borderland, including the lack of integrated strategies institutions, and resources. This is linked to a low level of community-driven development solutions and a low level of inter-sectoral cooperation.

Strong civil societies and the innovative energies they unleash can contribute to the bottom-up renewal of existing transnational cooperation governance structures and the emergence of new cooperation structures.

Since its inception in 1995, the Carpathian Foundation working with civil society organizations recognized these new challenges and launched the Carpathian Civil Society Platform and Hub, a space for CSOs to exchange and share experiences, learn from each other, build partnerships, and implement joint projects across borders.

The creation of the Platform was preceded by an 18-month participatory-based process that involved more than 100 civil society organizations via workshops, focus group meetings, etc., and the results of the process have been summarized in a comprehensive Feasibility Study, which analyzed the situation of the state of civil societies in the Carpathians, described the goals, and guiding principles, and suggested the structure and possible functions and activities of the Platform.

The main objective of the Platform is to amplify the voice of civil society actors at local, regional, and inter-regional levels, strengthen their capacity, and promote cross-border cooperation through networking with civil society actors. Since its creation, local networks have been established in the five sub-regions of the Carpathians; capacity-building training has been organized; a micro-grants program has been launched; annual inter-regional (Carpathian level) meetings have been held to exchange experiences and build partnerships between civil society organizations and the Carpathian Social Innovation Award has been launched.
